





Performance Notes:

in three, one, and seven should be performed gently, and accurately throughout. The performers should play every note before section G (except for the tremolos) with the same velocity on each instrument. The piece may be amplified; however if it is not, the players should adjust their common dynamic according to the venue.

The piece should be played with a click track, split to three sets of headphones.

The performers should be situated as follows:



Each performer has 7 separate instruments. These may be pitched semi-pitched or unpitched, and should have the following timbre and decay:

- RH Hard Rubber Beater
- 2. Mid-high Pitch/Timbre short decay
- RH Hard Rubber Beater
- RH Hard Rubber Beater

[the players must have the same instruments from 1-3 (i.e. all three instrument 1's are the same)]

4. High Pitch/Timbre – short-mid decay - LH Medium-Hard Beater 5. Middling Pitch/Timbre - middling decay - LH Medium-Hard Beater 6. Middling Pitch/Timbre - long decay - LH Medium-Hard Beater 7. Mid-Low Pitch/Timbre – very long decay - LH Medium-Hard Beater

[all instruments from 4-7 may be different as long as they follow similar sound profiles]

The performers are in rhythmical unison for the first six sections of the piece [A - F]. For each note, the instrument struck is indicated in a circle above the note. In the score, the order of the instruments is as follows: player 1 is closest to the note, player 2 is in the middle, and player 3 is on the top.





Indicates that the players should play a tremolo gesture on one note only. This gesture should be performed by placing the beater on the instrument and rubbing it gently back and fourth twice (i.e. up-down-up-down). This should be done relatively quickly; the intention is to add a clearly different timbral resonance to the decay. The gesture should be understated and should sound quieter than the attacks in the other instruments; however it should last slightly longer.
