

Perc. II

Mark tree Tam-tam (large) Floor tom-tom Gran Cassa

### Perc. III

Triangle (large/dark - mounted) Suspended cymbal Gong (medium/small)

 Gong (meaium/small)

 2 Bongos (low/high)

 Notation and performance

 The time scale is indicated above every system. The timing should be adhered to as closely as possible, though stopwatches or timers should not be used in performance.

Vertical dashed lines indicate simultaneous events, solid lines indicate chronology and dotted lines are suggested synchronization cues.

Choice of mallets/beaters is at the discretion of the performers.

# Staging

If possible the three percussion stations should be spread fairly widely across the stage/performance space, with Perc. II at the centre.
