JABA 768 was composed for Svein Finnerud Trio, commissioned by Ny Musikk (The Norwegian Section of ISCM) and first performed at Molde Jazz Festival 1968. During the process of composition it became imperative that vital aspects of the distinctive qualities of musicians and composer must be preserved. In other words, the composer should communicate his intentions without committing the musicians to a form of expression they would perhaps find inadequate, he should communicate in a way that was directly perceptive, and so aproximative that it could accommodate and unite the various intentions of the co - creators.

The score consists of 8 pages each constituting one section. They should be played in the given order. Pages 3 and 6 may be played backwards thus, together with the preceeding pages, constitute sections with a bow form. The score is ment to give directions and guidance concerning the main form and the elements shaping it, though not in detail. Each page may have a duration of ca. 1 min. (+ + 30 - 50 %). Page 1. A very soft noise, first in the high register, later falling, is suppressed by the increasing activity of three distinct motives. On page 2 theese motives are slowly concealed by a stationary chord-tapestry, growing in breadth and thensity. This chord material is used to form the objects of page 3. Page 4 is \_ like page 7 to jeremiade, a lamento, acry, releasing desperate aggressions. On page 7 this expression is appeared by soft and nice objects. Page 5 is a big crescendo formed by phrases all well known and characteristic for the performers and/or with rhythmic beat the music they usually are occupied with:

Thereussive objects without beat calm and soft melodic/harmonic formulas

nice, funny and banal mere cliché

Page 6 had the same form as page 3, the material is rougher. Page 8: Stringent building of a big crescendo leading to a general pause which is followed by an explosive attace and a fast morendo. The general pause may even last until the audience begins to applaud or leave the hall. Page numbers are indicated by black dots in the lower left corner of each page.
